**EDUCATION**

- Candidate refused to complete survey. Please call her for her answers.** Allowing students who attend a private school or home school to enroll in an academic course within their public school district. *Act 173 (HB1208)*
- Candidate refused to complete survey. Please call her for her answers.** Amending the “Tim Tebow” law by allowing home schoolers to participate in interscholastic activities outside their resident school district as long as both school districts agree. *Act 592 (HB1474)*
- Candidate refused to complete survey. Please call her for her answers.** Allowing home school students to participate in interscholastic activities at any private school within 25 miles of the student’s home if the private school is a member of the Arkansas Activities Association. *Act 453 (HB1481)*
- Candidate refused to complete survey. Please call her for her answers.** Simplifying the Notice of Intent to Home School form and ensuring local school districts keep home school families and their personal information confidential. *Act 635 (HB1574)*
- Candidate refused to complete survey. Please call her for her answers.** Requiring public school districts to give a home schooler who enrolls or re-enrolls in a public school the same rights and privileges enjoyed by the public school students. *Act 863 (HB1740)*
- Candidate refused to complete survey. Please call her for her answers.** Creating a four-year pilot program offering education savings accounts for K-12 students. These funds are used to cover educational expenses such as private school tuition or home school expenses. *(SB746) Failed in the House*

**ABORTION**

- Candidate refused to complete survey. Please call her for her answers.** Banning dilation and evacuation abortions, a procedure in which the unborn child is dismembered and ripped apart limb from limb. *Act 45 (HB1032)*
- Candidate refused to complete survey. Please call her for her answers.** Strengthening inspections of abortion clinics by the Health Department and requiring them to immediately shut down an abortion clinic if it fails inspection. *Act 383 (HB1428)*
- Candidate refused to complete survey. Please call her for her answers.** Prohibiting sex-selection abortions. *Act 733 (HB1434)*
- Candidate refused to complete survey. Please call her for her answers.** Prohibiting experimentation on organs and tissue harvested from unborn babies and requiring aborted babies to be respectfully cremated or buried. *Act 603 (HB1566)*
- Candidate refused to complete survey. Please call her for her answers.** Requiring abortion clinics that perform an abortion on a child less than 17 years of age to preserve fetal tissue extracted during the abortion in case the girl was a victim of a sexual crime. *Act 1018 (HB2024)*
- Candidate refused to complete survey. Please call her for her answers.** Requiring doctors to give a baby born alive during an abortion life-sustaining medical treatment. *Act 392 (SB148)*
- Candidate refused to complete survey. Please call her for her answers.** Banning “wrongful birth” lawsuits where parents of a baby born with a disability or genetic disorder sue their doctor claiming they would have aborted their baby if they had known their baby might have a disability. *Act 385 (SB340)*



## MARIJUANA

14. **Candidate refused to complete survey.**  
Please call her for her answers. Prohibiting marijuana smoking anywhere tobacco smoking is prohibited by law; around children under age 14; in the presence of pregnant women; in a motor vehicle; and prohibits anyone under 21 from smoking marijuana. *Act 740 (HB1400)*
15. **Candidate refused to complete survey.**  
Please call her for her answers. Requiring marijuana products to be sold in childproof packaging, limiting the amount of THC in food and drink, and other restrictions. *Act 1023 (HB1991)*
16. **Candidate refused to complete survey.**  
Please call her for her answers. Allowing the Marijuana Commission to prohibit the cultivation of marijuana at dispensaries. *(SB254) Failed in House Rules Committee*
17. **Candidate refused to complete survey.**  
Please call her for her answers. Prohibiting companies from making and selling food or drink infused with marijuana. *(SB333) Failed in the Senate*
18. **Candidate refused to complete survey.**  
Please call her for her answers. Banning all marijuana smoking anywhere in Arkansas. *(SB357) Failed in the Senate*

## LAWSUITS

19. **Candidate refused to complete survey.**  
Please call her for her answers. Amending the Arkansas Deceptive Trade Practices Act and making it more difficult for citizens to sue and collect damages in deceptive trade lawsuits. *Act 986 (HB1742)*

## ALCOHOL

20. **Candidate refused to complete survey.**  
Please call her for her answers. Expanding wine sales in grocery stores and big box stores like Walmart and Kroger. *Act 508 (SB284)*

## LOTTERY

21. **Candidate refused to complete survey.**  
Please call her for her answers. Allowing retailers to accept debit cards when selling lottery tickets. *Act 876 (SB617)*

## RESOLUTIONS

22. **Candidate refused to complete survey.**  
Please call her for her answers. Calling for a convention of states to propose a federal marriage amendment defining marriage as the union of one man and one woman. *(SJR7) Failed in the House*
23. **Candidate refused to complete survey.**  
Please call her for her answers. Calls on Congress to refer out a federal pro-life amendment ending abortion. *(SJR9) Passed both chambers*

## 2018 BALLOT MEASURES

24. **Candidate refused to complete survey.**  
Please call her for her answers. Amending the Arkansas Constitution to require a vote of at least 60% for the passage of all state constitutional amendments; petition drives to amend the constitution would be required to gather signatures from more counties; and the Attorney General would have the authority to reject or rewrite the wording of ballot measures. *(HJR1003) Failed in the Senate*
25. **Candidate refused to complete survey.**  
Please call her for her answers. Amending the Arkansas Constitution to let the legislature limit the amount of money a person can collect and which evidence can be used in all personal injury lawsuits; juries and courts would no longer set damage amounts and rules of evidence. *(SJR8) Referred by the legislature for a statewide vote on the November 2018 General Election Ballot.*
