| 5. | FOR | AGAINST | NOT VOTING | Updating Arkansas' restrictions on abortion-inducing drugs and outlining requirements that abortionists must follow when administering abortion-inducing drugs, and prohibits abortion-inducing drugs from being delivered by mail. <i>Act 562 (HB1402)</i> |
| 6. | FOR | AGAINST | NOT VOTING | Affirming the right of municipalities to declare their city as a pro-life city and provides language that cities can use for their pro-life resolution. <i>Act 392 (HB1544)</i> |
| 7. | FOR | AGAINST | NOT VOTING | Creating an informed consent process for chemical abortion, ensuring women are informed of its risks, consequences, and pro-life alternatives. <i>Act 560 (HB1572)</i> |
| 8. | FOR | AGAINST | NOT VOTING | Requiring any clinic that performs abortions to be licensed by the Arkansas Department of Health as an abortion facility, and prohibits abortions in hospitals except to save the life of the mother. <i>Act 949 (SB388)</i> |
| 9. | FOR | AGAINST | NOT VOTING | Strengthening Arkansas law concerning abortion facility inspections, and requires abortionists to file documentation that a crime has been reported to law enforcement when the woman is a victim of rape or incest. <i>Act 787 (SB463)</i> |
| 10. | FOR | AGAINST | NOT VOTING | Creating felony offenses for fraud and abuse in fertility treatments. <i>Act 609 (SB474)</i> |
| 11. | FOR | AGAINST | NOT VOTING | Requiring written agreements between an abortion facility and a hospital and requires abortion facilities to post information regarding human trafficking. <i>Act 740 (SB527)</i> |
| 12. | FOR | AGAINST | NOT VOTING | Prohibiting all abortions in Arkansas except in cases to save the life of the mother. <i>Act 309 (SB6)</i> |
| 13. | FOR | AGAINST | NOT VOTING | Requiring abortionists to show an ultrasound image of the unborn baby to the pregnant woman before an abortion. <i>Act 498 (SB85)</i> |

14. FOR	AGAINST	NOT VOTING	Protecting churches and other religious organizations from being forced by the government to close during an emergency or similar disaster and recognizes them as essential. <i>Act 94 (HB1211)</i>

18. FOR	AGAINST	NOT VOTING	Prohibiting sex-change surgeries and procedures such as puberty blockers and cross-sex hormones on children. <i>VETO OVERRIDE of Act 626 (HB1570)</i>
19. FOR	AGAINST	NOT VOTING	Preventing biological males from competing against biological females in sports at schools. <i>Act 461 (SB354)</i>

21. FOR	AGAINST	NOT VOTING	Reducing the amount of sales tax on a used vehicle from 6.5% to 3.5% for used vehicles sold at \$4,000 to \$10,000. <i>Act 1013 (HB1912)</i>
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HATE CRIMES

22. FOR	AGAINST	NOT VOTING	Creating vague protected classes in our state law and enhanced penalties for certain offenders. <i>Act 681 (SB622)</i>
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2022 BALLOT MEASURES

23. FOR	AGAINST	NOT VOTING	Amending the Arkansas Constitution to prevent the government from burdening a person's free exercise of religion. <i>(SJR14) Referred by the legislature for a statewide vote on the November 2022 General Election Ballot.</i>
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
