15. **FOR** **AGAINST** **NOT VOTING** Protecting healthcare workers' rights of conscience to decline to participate in non-emergency procedures that violate their moral, religious, or ethical convictions. *Act 462 (SB289)*
16. **FOR** **AGAINST** **NOT VOTING** Creating an annual Day of Prayer for Arkansas Students on the last Wednesday of September. *Act 902 (SB662)*

LGBTQ AGENDA

17. **FOR** **AGAINST** **NOT VOTING** Prohibiting sex-change surgeries and procedures such as puberty blockers and cross-sex hormones on children. *Act 626 (HB1570)*
18. **FOR** **AGAINST** **NOT VOTING** Prohibiting sex-change surgeries and procedures such as puberty blockers and cross-sex hormones on children. *VETO OVERRIDE of Act 626 (HB1570)*
19. **FOR** **AGAINST** **NOT VOTING** Preventing biological males from competing against biological females in sports at schools. *Act 461 (SB354)*

ALCOHOL

20. **FOR** **AGAINST** **NOT VOTING** Allowing cities, municipalities, or towns to designate certain areas in dry counties, as "entertainment districts," allowing the public consumption of alcohol. *Act 874 (HB1228)*

TAXES

21. **FOR** **AGAINST** **NOT VOTING** Reducing the amount of sales tax on a used vehicle from 6.5% to 3.5% for used vehicles sold at \$4,000 to \$10,000. *Act 1013 (HB1912)*

HATE CRIMES

22. **FOR** **AGAINST** **NOT VOTING** Creating vague protected classes in our state law and enhanced penalties for certain offenders. *Act 681 (SB622)*

2022 BALLOT MEASURES

23. **FOR** **AGAINST** **NOT VOTING** Amending the Arkansas Constitution to prevent the government from burdening a person's free exercise of religion. *(SJR14) Referred by the legislature for a statewide vote on the November 2022 General Election Ballot.*

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
